Year 13 - Sixth Subject

All students in Year 13 are expected to study Religious studies and Five other subjects.

The Sixth Subject maybe:

- A full year traditional course
- A Semester course that may or may not include a supervised study
- Full year of supervised study

Semester Course Options

Semester courses will run Semester 1 (Term 1 & 2) or Semester 2 (Term 3). You may choose to do a Semester 1 Course and your Semester 2 Course could be a supervised study
